



2016 R&D Management Conference Funding Terms and Conditions

These terms and conditions relate to requests under RADMA's R&D Management Conference Funding Programme. The funding is for up to £450 towards the Conference Fee for Masters and PhD students presenting a paper at the conference.

Funding is awarded across the breadth of the research and development management discipline. RADMA particularly encourages applications that explore important relevant issues or further understanding in the following areas:

1. Management of scientific and technological activity
2. Management of research development, product design and innovation
3. Strategy formulation and human resources
4. Management of technology and policy

The awards provide support to talented mid-study Masters and PhD students to attend the R&D Management Conference. Candidates must be undertaking a Masters or PhD within the research and development management discipline at a university.

The award covers a contribution to the conference fees only.

Awards process

Though the funding for this programme is from RADMA, the scheme is operated by the organisers of the conference according to guidelines set by RADMA.

The budget for the funding programme is fixed, and the conference organisers will aim to achieve the optimum level of student participation within this budget. Applications will be judged on the basis of the quality and relevance of the paper submitted, the amount of funding sought by the applicant and the totality of funding requested by all applicants. The award may be lower than the amount originally requested, and students may be asked to discuss their needs with the organisers.

The closing date for applications 01/02/16, with awards announced by 15/03/2016.

Candidates are restricted to one application each to attend the 2016 Conference. The outcome of that application does not preclude the candidate from applying for the 2017 Conference (once the call for applications for 2017 is open), nor does it affect the candidate's future chances of success.

If an application is successful, the conference fees will be reduced accordingly. RADMA requires a copy of any papers presented and a brief post-conference report on the impact of the Conference upon the candidate's studies. This will contribute to RADMA's assessment of its impact in the field of R&D management.

A condition of the grant is that you attend the entire conference. If you do not attend then you will be required to repay any grant you have received.
